Throughout her career, she has cared for patients presenting with aneurysmal subarachnoid hemorrhage and their loved ones across the continuum of care. For many years she was a bedside critical care nurse. As a nurse practitioner for the last twelve years, she managed patients with both ruptured and unruptured aneurysms and a variety of other neurologic conditions both in the in and outpatient arena. For many years she precepted FNP students for Columbia University and has been a guest lecturer delivering the neurologic content. In addition, she has lectured extensively on a variety of neurologic topics to nurses and community members. She is past-president of the American Association of Neuroscience Nurses of NYC and remains on the board of directors, she is a member of the Lisa Colagrossi Foundation Medical Advisory Board and remains a facilitator for the Montefiore Medical Center Stroke Support Group. In 2019, she lobbied in Washington, DC in support of “Ellie’s Law” with the Brain Aneurysm Foundation.

Janet was initially a Diploma Nursing graduation from the Cochran School of Nursing in Yonkers, NY; holds a BSN and MS in Nursing from Mercy College in Dobbs Ferry, NY and a Post-Master’s Certificate as an FNP from the College of Mount Saint Vincent, Bronx, NY. A life-long learner, she received a Doctorate in Nursing Practice from New York University in 2014. She is board certified by ANCC as an FNP, as a critical care nurse and a neuroscience nurse.
